

Marylebone News

Proposed Ward Boundary - "What no Bryanston & Dorset Square Ward"



The Marylebone Association indicative area we have highlighted in Red

Westminster City Council have submitted their proposals to the Boundary Commission. The proposals see the current Bryanston & Dorset Square Ward disappear. Instead the Association area would have part of Hyde Park ward and the West End ward would account for a larger part of our area to the south. Marylebone High Street ward gets renamed just Marylebone ward and is stretched across the north part of our area. We will watch any future developments with interest!

Armed Robbery on Duke Street

Three men have been arrested over an armed raid on a luxury watch shop. The incident took place at the Hour House on Duke Street. 'Police were called at 10.32am on Tuesday, 28 May following reports that men armed with weapons drove to the premises on mopeds and smashed a window before stealing goods and fleeing.

Marylebone Residents drive the least polluting cars in the country

New statistics released by the DVLA show which postcodes have the highest and lowest proportions of vehicles that produce the most carbon dioxide. Looking across the UK, the data shows people living in the W1G postcode district – which covers Harley Street and parts of Marylebone came out greenest. A startling 16.5 per cent of cars registered in the area, roughly one in six, produce no CO2 emissions. I am pleased to report that four of the Marylebone Association committee all drive zero polluting EVs, but only one live in the W1G postcode.

Marylebone LEN's Diesel Surcharge to go Westminster wide

Following the successful trial of the diesel parking surcharge by the Marylebone LEN - the surcharge is due to be rolled out across Westminster in September. The scheme reduced the number of older diesels visiting the area by 16 per cent and the council said drivers had not parked on nearby streets, meaning that pollution was cut rather than displaced. This local success has been copied by other London councils, including Camden, Islington and the City of London, have diesel parking surcharges. Islington imposes a surcharge on all diesels, because it claims that no clean diesel vehicle has been produced. Thank you to our all our local ward Councillors and Cllr Heather Acton and Cllr David Harvey for bravely pioneering this policy.

The President of the United States (POTUS), Donald Trump, is due to attend a State Visit to the UK, visiting London from 3 to 5 June 2019. We can expect to hear lots of helicopters flying to Winfield House

Join us at the iconic Bank of England, sometimes known as the "Old Lady" of Threadneedle Street founded by Royal Charter in 1694. Our visit commences with a presentation giving a brief history since its foundation and describing its main role and functions today as a regulator of interest rates and issuer of bank notes.

After the presentation, we can visit the museum which includes historical items and glittering displays of gold, including Roman and modern gold bars, alongside pikes and muskets, once used to defend the bank

Explore yet more surprising local connections with famous figures such as Vaslav Nijinsky, Kathleen Ferrier and Ralph Vaughan Williams. On the final evening can transport yourself to a Marylebone of the past for a 1920s dinner and soirée.
